Dear Mr. Reinhold:

Thank you very much for your information and suggestions on Drake.

Enclosed you will find a Summary of the Oak Island Operations and Plans as well as the latest book on the subject of Oak Island - The Money Pit.

We believe our findings might indicate a connection between this archaeological and historical mystery and Drake's explorations. Our findings seem to show that the workings are of English origin dating about the last quarter of the 16th century; and that the construction was protected by water. In addition, there is evidence that the site was used for the refurbishing of ships. It was certainly in a secluded area - although, surprisingly enough, not that far in sailing time from the route back to England.

When the site was discovered in 1795, it was apparently in pristine condition and one has to think this was purposely done for reasons of secrecy and security (e.g. the Spanish).

In addition, I am enclosing a copy of Alistair's Cooke's introductory remarks to the program "Drake's Venture". I seem to remember Mr. Cooke mentioning at that time that Drake's logs were handed directly to Queen Elizabeth I and have never surfaced since, however, these remarks are not contained in the transcript.
